In addition to some mighty good cooking, we will have a 50-50 raffle, a silent auction and some simply scrumptious desserts for sale.

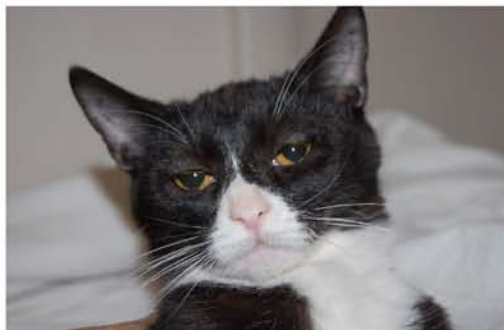

Angel was found on I5 near the Metz Hill exit during the month of December. The people that found her knew that she was seriously injured so they transported her to Saving Grace. Due to Angel having a clipped ear Saving Grace called us. Sure enough Angel's left rear leg had a spiral fracture and her right rear hip was out of place. She had surgery to repair her left leg and as soon as it is healed she will have surgery to repair her right hip. The picture above is of her with her leg in the after surgery wrap.

So once again we are asking for your help. Angel's first surgery was over \$1200. This does not include the trips in to have the leg checked to see how it is healing nor does it include the surgery on her right leg. If you can help with her bills we would so appreciate it.

You can use the envelope enclosed wth this newsletter and just make a note that it is for Angel. Any funds raised over the amount of her total care will be used for other emergency vet bills.

Thanks so much for your help and for your care. Please come in and meet her. She is a sweet, sweet girl who loves attention. She is confined to a cage while she heals and probably a bit bored! She'd love to meet you and, of course, will need a permanent home after both of her legs are healed.

And a huge Thank you!!! to Bailey Vet Clinic for their wonderful care of Angel and all the other animals they care for. (Editor's note - the day this newsletter went to print Angel had to be rushed back to Baileys due to a severe infection. She'll be there for a couple of days.)

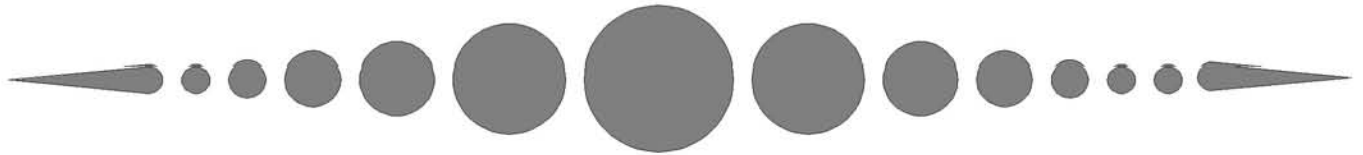

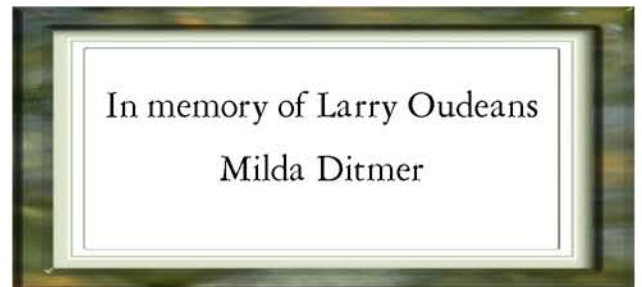
Please remember us in your will
