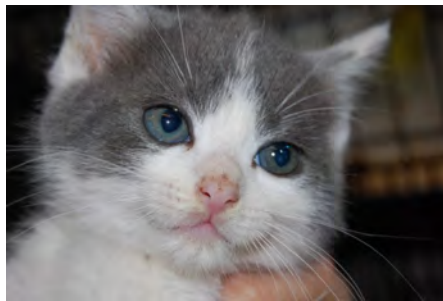

Feral Cat Feeding

About 15 years ago I saw some stray cats at the duck pond and I started putting out food for them. (there is not a colony there now). Little did I know what an adventure I got myself into. Billye Whorton saw me feeding one day and asked if I'd be willing to help feed cats for the New Beginnings SPCA. I was very hesitant because I didn't want to get tied down, but I reluctantly said yes. We started out with two colonies of cats and we trapped them all and had them spayed and neutered. And returned to their established colony. So began our routine of feeding them daily. Since then it has grown to more than 20 colonies around town. We have a few good people that help us feed. The cats are all happy and thriving and have warm shelters to live in and a square meal every day. I am so thankful for those kind people who volunteer their time to feed these wonderful animals. Sadly there are many areas we cannot cover and those cats are left to fend for themselves. We can't do it all. Over the years we have helped hundreds of cats either find homes or get a square meal every day to keep warm in the winter.

We have had several people who have had to quit feeding for health reasons etc., and so I am looking for volunteers to join us in feeding these lovely feral cats. So if you are looking to volunteer your time, you can give me a call and make my day. You could feed as little as once a month, once a week, or more. No one ever feeds all 20+ colonies at once. We divide it up so that it isn't a burden on anyone. It's very rewarding to see the cats come running out all excited to see you. I know there are many people in this community that have a heart for animals and lots of love to give. I just need to connect with you.

Good News!

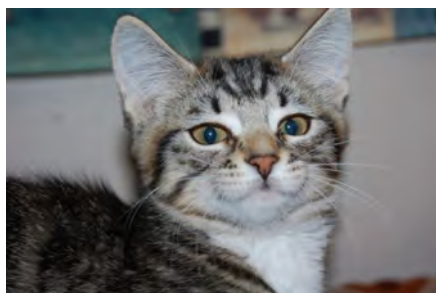
Angel has been adopted and gone to her forever home!

Douglas County Low-Cost Veterinary Services

541-672-3161

Douglas County Low-Cost Veterinary Services (DCLVS) is a nonprofit veterinary organization which has been formed to address the overpopulation crisis of unwanted dogs and cats in and around Douglas County by providing low-cost spay/neuter to low-income pet owners. After doing considerable research on the effects of low cost spay/neuter programs on the overpopulation of pets in the U.S., I found that what actually made a significant difference in both the intake and kill rates at shelters was targeting low income pet owners. It was well documented that a disproportionate number of animals that wind up at shelters come from low income owners.

Along with low-cost spay/neuter, DCLVS offers basic veterinary care to these same pet owners. Pet owners are screened for income eligibility by being on any public assistance program or by using DHS household income guidelines. Along with low-income pet owners, we also serve the spay/neuter and veterinary care needs of homeless pet owners and the non-profit animal welfare organizations of our area

With our **Feral Cat Program**, we do not require income screening. We do require that the cats actually be feral and must be ear notched during surgery. This is to encourage private citizens to step up and get the ferals around their properties spayed and neutered.

Our **Pets of the Homeless Program** clinics address the basic veterinary needs of homeless pet owners by providing wellness exams, vaccinations, de-worming, and flea and tick control at **no charge**. We also provide free pet food which has been donated to us by local area retailers and private citizens.

At this time, we are having our low cost spay and neuters performed at Oakland Veterinary Clinic by Dr. Steve Frack, who is filling in for Dr. Gore while he recovers from a stroke. Our low-cost vaccination clinics are held quarterly at various venues around Roseburg.

Our goal is to have our physical clinic up and running this fall. The clinic will be located on Umpqua Street behind the old cancer center.

All of us here at DCLVS look forward to a continued wonderful relationship between DCLVS and New Beginnings SPCA!
